

# TRADITIONAL COUNCIL OF THE

# P'EGP'ÍG7LHA CLAN

The P'egp'ig7lha Council, comprised of family representatives, is hereby mandated to carry out the following governing responsibilities:

- Conduct Government-to-Government and Nation-to-Nation negotiations related to St'at'line Title and Rights.
- Finalize P'egp'ig7lha governing documents including the constitution, laws, policies, and procedures.
- Work with Elders Council to create a system of laws to protect the traditional territory;
  - Make rules regarding and advocate for tribal/traditional territories and represent community on these issues.
- Work with the T'it'q'et Council to address community issues as required.
- Work with the Youth.
- Gather input from studies, needs assessments, and the legal status of issues related to the traditional territory, and generally keep informed about issues.
- Negotiate on behalf of the P'egp'ig7lha with all parties whose activitles may impact
  upon the P'egp'ig7lha.
- Communicate, inform, consult with the people, and monitor broad input ensuring all have a voice.
- o Seek advice of Elders Council to ensure St'át'imc principles are maintained.
- Seek ratification for decisions from the P'egp'ig7lha.
- · Maintain Intra and Inter-tribal relations on behalf of the P'egp'ig7iha.
- Keep abreast of and address International issues effecting Indigenous peoples.

The Tribal Chief will report to and chair all P'egp'íg7lha Council meetings. The P'egp'íg7lha Council will meet once monthly, and will meet with the Elders' Council and the T'ít'q'et Council quatterly.

## ELDERS COUNCIL OF THE P'EGP'ÍG7LHA CLAN

he Pegp'íg7lha Elders Council is herby mandated to carry out the following responsibilities:

#### LANGUAGE

Work with language authority. • Work with Statimc communities. • Encourage revival of language. Encourage written form. • Be role models in learning more about the language. Ensure language is accessible through modern technologies. • Teach youth and adults

#### CULTURE

Practice and encourage revival of ceremonies, spiritual beliefs, and traditional activities such as drumming, singing, and dancing. • Guide and oversee instituting of traditional system of laws, potlatching, name giving, birth and marriage ceremonies. • Ensure identification and maintenance of sacred sites. • Teach and pass down owledge. • Oversee care and treatment of ancestral remains. • Provide information and advice related to the ditional clan system - Pegp'ig7lha - other St'át'imc clans. • Be role models in learning more about the culture.

Lucipate in historical documentation of customs, land, and resource use.

#### CONSTITUTION

Continue to work with the Self Government Working Group and the Traditional Council in the development of the Pegp'ig7lha Constitution.

#### STEWARDSHIP

Make the ultimate decision regarding land and resource use.

#### HOLD VETO POWER

Upon direction from the Community, hold veto power over decisions of Traditional Council and Tit'q'et Council, which will be applicable to all matters.

## PROMOTE AND SUPPORT TRIBAL UNITY

By developing a St'át'imc Council of Elders

### TAKE LEADERSHIP

By developing a Justice system that is consistent with Tit'q'et principles and traditions and the will of the community. This may include rules concerning protection of children, discipline, protection laws, mediation, and enforcement.

#### HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT

Monitor and guide youth participation in government to ensure ongoing development of leadership.

e Elders Council will communicate with the people through General Meetings of the community. Work with the aditional Council, and where necessary, be involved with Chief and Council. Elders Council will have the cessary support staff as required.

## T'ÍT'Q'ET CHIEF AND COUNCIL OF THE P'EGP'ÍG7LHA CLAN

T'st'q'et Chief and Council's mandate is to ensure that good government is delivered to the community. Chief and Council will:

- Oversee T'ít'q'et Administration and staff, program services, committees, ad hoc committees and boards.
- Review and approve all fiscal year operating budgets.
- Work with Traditional Council regarding natural resources.
- Oversee all matters related to reserve lands.
- Work with youth.
- Oversee all Capital Projects.
- Conduct Government to Government relations regarding programs and services.
- Ensure sound accounting and financial management for all T'it'q'et programs and services, including Band revenues, taxation, Traditional Council and Elders Council budgets.
- Create committees, boards, etc., to assist in the service delivery of programs to members,
- Work in cooperation with the Traditional Council on matters related to family, policing and health services and other services as required.
- Develop policies and procedures.
- Make reports at general community meetings.
- · Work with Elders Council.

Chief and Council will work in cooperation with the T'it'q'et Traditional Council. Both Councils will meet jointly at least four times a year to ensure good communications and problem solving.
