Election Code

Copies of the Election Code may be obtained at the T'it'q'et reception desk; or on request via email from reception@titqet.org.

Electors may confirm that their names are on the Voters List by viewing the Voters List posted at the P'egp'ig'lha Community Centre (PCC).

Proxy

Proxy or notice of proxies held must be filed with T'it'q'et no later than 4:00 p.m. local time Friday, March 27, 2026. Proxy may be faxed to (250) 256-4544, or emailed to reception@titqet.org or dropped off at the reception desk at 59 Retasket Street, PCC. To receive a Proxy form, please contact reception@titqet.org or call (250) 256-4118, or pick one up at the T'it'q'et reception desk. An eligible voter may carry only one proxy.

It is the responsibility of the member to follow up with the receptionist (reception@titqet.org) or call (250) 256-4118 to ensure the emailed or faxed proxy form is received.

Eligibility of Voters

In order to be entitled to vote in an election, a person must, as of the date of the election:

- a)** have attained the age of eighteen (18) years;
- b)** be listed on the Membership Roll; and
- c)** be included on the Voters' List.

Eligibility of Candidates

To be eligible as a candidate for the office of Community Chief or Counsellor, the candidate must:

- a)** Be eligible as Voter, as defined in the T'it'q'et Election Code
- b)** Be nominated for that office, in accordance with procedures set out in the T'it'q'et Election Code;
- c)** Be "in good standing" with T'it'q'et Administration. For added clarity "Administration" in this section does not include other T'it'q'et entities, such as registered companies or societies that are wholly or partially owned by T'it'q'et;
- d)** Be ordinarily resident within one hundred (100) kilometres from the P'egp'ig'lha Community Centre Building near Lillooet; and
- e)** Not have been convicted of an indictable offence in Canada or a felony in the United States within four (4) years prior to his or her nomination, except, in some circumstances, where the conviction is for an offence relating to the assertion, exercise or protection of Aboriginal rights or title.

Definition of "In Good standing"

"In Good standing" means that a person is not in arrears or has any overdue debts or has any outstanding or pending litigation with T'it'q'et.

 - An eligible voter may carry only one proxy vote.

Definition: "By-election" means an election that is not a General Election and is held between General Elections to fill a vacant elected position

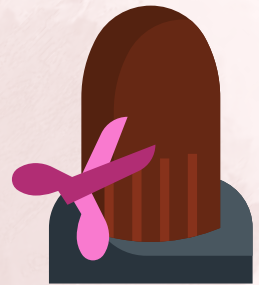

Good Day T'it'q'et Community, just a few notes for you:

Due to lack of staff for the Medical Clerk position, I was placed here October 2025. Prior to that, I was in Housing assisting Mike Leech, cleaning, filing, etc – when he requires assistance, I go over and help him out. Prior to Housing, I was Lands Officer. Which seems like such a long time ago. I know Dean misses me, he comes to try and rile me up in my office, which is a nice break from the sometimes hair straight back days. I have to say, I am enjoying my time here, it is at times challenging, but a great team helps the days not seem so tough. I have been provided a written offer, which I am perusing.

Training –

FNHA I do training with FNHA, regarding the Medical Travel System, my first training was beginning of December. Eye-opening to say the least. I participated with all regions of BC, and they have same issues that we do.

TeleHealth – training is this upcoming Wednesday.

Medical Appointments – previous Medical Clerks requested two weeks notice, which I'd like to keep in place, lately my office has received emails on a Friday for an appointment the following Tuesday. I can still provide assistance in the form of a purchase order for fuel/snacks. If your preference is for a cheque – in this instance, cheque run is the same day as the appointment, you can provide the confirmation of attendance when your cheque is ready for pickup on Wednesday.

Escorts – If you require an escort, a form needs to be signed by your doctor, I have in my office, I can provide the form to you. An Elder, aged 65 and over, do not require this form to be signed, it is automatic, an escort is allowed.

Confirmation of Attendance – please remember to get those in, when we do reporting to FNHA, this is a part of the reporting, was the appointment confirmed? If confirmations are not brought in, we may need to do a reimbursement (attend appointment and be reimbursed). Thank you to those who already bring in theirs in a timely manner. Alternatively, your doctor can send in by fax as well, our confidential fax is listed below.

Cheque Days – cheque runs are Tuesdays and Thursdays – with cheque release on Wednesday or Friday.

Hotel Stays – are not always granted. For example, an appointment in Kamloops, you can request your appointment to be late morning or early afternoon, which allows for safe travel during the morning and afternoon. Appointment times with doctors are usually flexible, letting them know your situation (if can only drive during daylight, etc) they can adjust your appointment time to something more desirable. **Overnight accommodation Reimbursement**

Should clients choose to book their own room please note that parking is not covered and will not be reimbursed for the overnight stay. I will remove the parking fee from the total cost of the hotel invoice.

For clients booking their own hotel if you choose to redeem points for your hotel, you will not be reimbursed your hotel invoice, as there was no cost to you since points were used for your overnight.

I require the hotel invoice for patient travel reimbursement along with the confirmation of attendance slip to process patient travel reimbursements.

This program within T'it'q'et Administration always runs a deficit, and this is due to FNHA being so behind in their system. I have received an email for reporting that was done by one of my predecessors that they are looking for information from client appointments from April of 2025. Thank you Nicole and Michael for your awesome filing, I have been able to locate any required information.

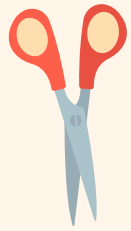

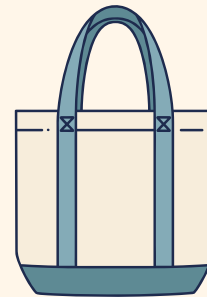

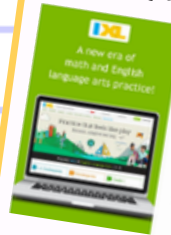

Hello, Community, my name is Michael Leech, I started in apr/may25. I have worked for T'it'q'et Community for the past 25+years. Working on, and/or building many of our beautiful buildings/houses. I bring a vast knowledge of all Building Codes and Compliances. And look forward to working for our T'it'q'et Members to make their homes feel safe and sound. Here is my report for 25/26.

Renovations: Work projects are progressing steadily, have lots of completions. We have narrowed down our Contractor Relationships to a select few who we can count on to do quality workmanship.

Russel Adams contracting, CTP Contracting, Lillooet Electric, Curto HVAC, Haddon Heating. Tilalus Contracting has been overseeing a lot of the work to make sure everything is done to code. With the main objective being safety and quality for our T'it'q'et Community Housing.

Housing Policy:

There is a new housing policy that will was worked on by Mandell Pinder, alongside Admin, and Titqet housing. We are currently waiting for it to get adopted by Titqet Chief and Council. Among some of the important topics for implementation is a stricter pet policy on loose and aggressive dogs. Again, a main objective is the safety of our T'it'q'et Members

Annual Inspections: We will be Coordinating with our Journeyman Contractor to schedule Inspections for all of our Rental Units for any needed repairs etc.

Chimney Sweeps:

Housing has partnered with Haddon Heating for the chimney sweeps for tenants. There were several homes not up to code, Haddon has since brought them up to code and the tenants can safely use their pellet and/ or wood burning units. Reminder: Please refrain from burning Green/Unseasoned/ Pitchy Wood, this can lead to the chimney to accumulate more than normal creosote, which then cause chimney fires. Preferably Only use non-colored newspaper type paper.

General items:

Phone calls/emails and texts with tenants, homeowners, coworkers, contractors, supervisors. Budgets, and rent arrears. Appliance repairs and or new orders. --Maintenance calls from tenants/homeowners- find a contractor to help with the work, pay invoice upon its arrival-Order tenant items from The Brick Kamloops, arrange for pick up and delivery from Cayuse Transportation.

Forums/Workshops:

I attended the Matrimonial Topics in the fall. It was very informative. As we don't have our own committees for this we still fall under the Federal Guidelines. Hopefully we can get our own going to move forward for our T'it'q'et Members.

I also attended a Housing Forum this New year. Learned a lot on the different avenues of funding partners we will also have options for in this coming new year. Lots of information on Radon and what we will be able to implement into the safety of all our T'it'q'et members housing. Achieved a lot of networking with a variety of companies.

We are currently in the process of accessing RRAP funding for a number of homes for our Elders and Accessibility for Seniors. And a number of other project funding for some new construction in our community, will keep everyone posted. As well as a number of Houses applied for Mold Funding. Kukstem, All my Relations

Downton Wildfire: Helping Residents with their restoration

Last year, with funding support from the Squamish Lillooet Regional District, LRISS undertook a special project following the 2023 Downton Wildfire, which destroyed properties on the west side of Gun Lake. The intense fire removed the plant understory and much of the topsoil, leaving the area vulnerable to invasive species. At the request of SLRD Area A Director Sal Demare, LRISS led an inventory and monitoring project to assess what vegetation (native and invasive) is returning. In summer 2025, three property owners granted permission for the LRISS team to carry out this work.

The goals for this project that were successfully completed include:

1. Determine what species of invasive plant infestations exist along the main road adjacent to the property.
2. Determine what species of invasive plant exist on the property.
3. Determine key areas of vegetation regrowth: naturally regenerating and seeded areas. Map these areas and collect detailed plant information using plots.
4. Make recommendation for participating land owners about the management of invasive species.



We're pleased to report that all property owners were actively managing invasive plants and were knowledgeable about many of the species on their land. LRISS staff were able to build on that knowledge and provide further support. A diverse native plant community has returned since the 2023 fire, and while two seed mixes were applied, their establishment has been variable. Invasive infestations were limited, and LRISS provided prioritized recommendations for removal.

Great news! There were no high priority species or new species to our area.

Using the prevention measures and insights from the three detailed reports, we will develop an information sheet to support residents restoring their properties and preventing invasive plant infestations. With landowner permission, we will return in 2026 to survey the established plots.
